

Ukraine's courage, our commitment



Beetroot, which had nearly 400 team members in the country as of 2022, has partnered with the Swedish fundraising foundation loca Arma Nostra to support war-affected people and particularly vulnerable Ukrainian families with children. The fund engages Beetroot's extensive network of colleagues and peers in Ukraine to channel the donations into grassroots humanitarian aid, primarily focused on supporting impactful and tangible local community initiatives.

Collected donations are also distributed to other humanitarian (non-military) charities in Ukraine that Beetroot selects after careful background review.







♥ Local initiatives

As a result of the war, millions of Ukrainians are in severe humanitarian crisis situations. People remaining in dangerous areas often have no access to basic supplies, sometimes living for weeks with no water and almost no food. Others have relocated to safer zones and left everything behind. Thousands need clothing, provisions, and other necessities to meet their basic needs. Beetroot Fund cooperates with trusted charities and volunteer organizations such as Dobrodiy Cclub, Tak Shtab, RescueNOW, Divchata, Dzherelo, Kaizen, Edukoht, teachers for Mariupol, savED, Repair.together, Kinds, etc.

Together, we were able to help many people in dangerous areas, IDPs, people with disabilities, children, and hospital patients.



As part of our humanitarian support, we work with the Dobrodiy Club, Tak Shtab, and RescueNOW, that provide special gift boxes containing items to match different people's personal needs., e.g. toys, hygiene kits, and clothes.

Activity description

The projects in this direction aim to help IDP children and their families have an opportunity to recover through sports activities and psychological and social support. Even though war mostly destroys, such tough period may become a growth point especially for kids. One of our initiatives is designed to inspire children to pursue personal growth, demonstrate resilience, and make positive contributions to their communities, all while bolstering their mental health and morale.





Results

4,195

Kids' rehab spots covered (camps, psychological support, rehabilitation centers, physical rehabilitation)

> "I feel like I'm alive again!" — were the words of 16-year-old participant of I did it camp — Nastia on the last day.

One of the initiatives supported:

Activity description

Psychological support for IDP families with children with autism. The dedicated psychologists at KI(N)D's work closely with children on a spectrum and their parents, empowering families to engage positively with each other and society. \$1k (monthly) — 3 families will receive support with 4 sessions each with a psychotherapist and rehabilitation physician.

Results

- 28 IDP families with ASD whose lives were affected by the war;
- 4 transformative sessions with a psychologist monthly 270 sessions overall ;
- A 3-month program;
- A team of 3 psychologists;
- •29 kids who have the opportunity for a better life experience (1 family has 2 kids).

This project is a lifeline for families like Natalia's, whose 3-year-old son Denys is finding new ways to connect with the world. "This project is not just assistance; it's our last hope for a normal life for my son," shares Natalia.







Activity description

With this focus area we support projects that provide school supplies for Ukrainian kids from IDP families in de-occupied territories who are unable to afford the basics for their education or all necessary supplies for online studying. This projects give Ukrainian kids an access to high-quality education that allows them to achieve their goals and contribute to the development of the country.

Its also includes projects with individual scholarships providing for studies in IT, private schools for IDP kids.

Results

- 240 kids received a backpacks with school supplies with RescueNOW
- 50 IDP children receive backpacks equipped with stationery and electronic tablets, enabling them to pursue their education online.
- 4 IDP kids received a 1,5 year scholarships for education in Kaizen microschools



Activity description

We support projects that unite people to rebuild destroyed homes, community centers and restore educational infrastructure in regions affected by the war.

Additionally, we helping children restore access to quality education by creating accessible edu spaces.

Results


- Creating an educational room in Mykolaiv lyceum for 300 IDP kids with savED
- Restoring the natural sciences lab in a destroyed school in the Chernihiv region with savED
- Restoring 13 houses with Brave to rebuild
- Restoring a cultural center building in Kyiv region with Repair Together
